Administrative Order of the City Manager

Amendment 3 to Administrative Order No.: 2021-03 **Title:** Updated Health, Safety, and Decorum in City Facilities

Ordered: February 18, 2022 **Effective:** February 18, 2022

AUTHORITY: Coral Gables City Charter, Article II, Sec. 11 "Appointment, Term, Removal, Absence or Disability" and Sec. 15 "Specific powers and duties";

PURPOSE

As Chief Executive Officer of the City with the authority to exercise control over City departments, the City Manager can establish standards for the operation of City departments, facilities, programs, and events, and can enforce the City's policies regarding decorum¹.

Consistent with the City Manager's powers and with the City's authority when acting in its proprietary capacity, the City will require certain measures to preserve health, safety, and decorum within the City's facilities, parks, and events.

APPLICABILITY

This Order is applicable to all City facilities, including leased office space, City parks and City events.

Health, Safety, and Decorum Standards in City Facilities

Members of the public who enter City facilities shall be required to submit to a screening prior to entering the facilities. Individuals entering City facilities are required to wear shirts and shoes as a minimum standard of dress and are required to comply with the City's policies regarding public decorum. Masks/facial coverings continue to be required on public transit, like the City's trolley system, per federal guidelines. A reasonable accommodation will be made for individuals who are unable to comply with the health and safety precautions stated herein to allow access to essential government services.

Health, Safety, and Decorum Standards in Parks and Recreational Programs

Participants in City events and recreational programs must comply with the specific health, safety, and decorum standards associated with each event or program. Park goers must comply with posted signage at City parks and must wear shirts and shoes as a minimum standard of dress.

City Employees

City employees must continue to abide by the health, safety, and decorum standards established by City policies, Personnel Rules, and S.O.P. as applicable, which may differ from the standards stated herein.
