

- 1. Fire alarm work completed, inspected and approved
  - Panel must be green all systems normal to begin testing, no exceptions
  - One floor per day
  - Team of alarm, electrician, doors
  - Label ALL devices, including strobes, EOL, batteries
  - Smoke doors?
  - Elevator recall requires Miami-Dade County elevator inspector approval prior to CG inspection
  - Access control?
  - Hood suppression system?
- 2. Fire sprinklers work completed, inspected and approved
  - Pump startup
  - Standpipes
  - Underground
  - Tampers and flows
  - PRV's
- 3. Smoke control work completed, inspected and approved
  - Schedule pre-inspection meeting with mechanical and fire
  - Approved by mechanical and fire
  - One floor/area per day
  - Two bombs per bucket, one person per bucket
  - Tape a smoke bomb layout in each elevator lobby
  - Need someone to clear all staircases
- 4. BDA work completed, inspected, approved and online, verified by Jason Swift (CG Radio)
- 5. Final fire walk through
  - Safe enough for a two-year-old to run around
  - FD access
  - Generator startup is last no exceptions
  - Exit signs
  - Emergency lights
  - Extinguishers
  - Knox and Supra Max boxes
  - Addresses & Signage
  - Door closers
  - Furniture
- Partial TCO still requires all the above to be completed
- Have workers with spare parts, tools, ladders, etc.
- Regular inspections are 4 days in advance, overtime inspections are first come, first serve 24 hours advance notice.
- Test everything before calling for inspection.
